

## In California, most citizens can vote!

## You CAN vote if:

- You are 18 years or older on the day of the election.
- You are a U.S. Citizen.
- If you are on probation or PRCS you **CAN** vote.
- If you are serving a jail sentence you **CAN** vote. (You can vote by mail in jail and some jails set up polling stations.)
- If you have a conviction (felony or misdemeanor) you CAN vote.

## You cannot vote if:

- You are currently **serving a prison sentence** either in state prison, federal prison, or serving a prison sentence in a jail.
- You are currently on state parole.
- You were found mentally incomepetent *and* disqualified from voting by a court.
